

UKULELE CHORDS

Get to know the names of the chords and how they are positioned. This will help you build up your speed when you learn news songs as you will start to recognize familiar chords.



WHERE TO STRUM

If you strum your ukulele too close to the bridge it may sound tiny or too bright (which is sometimes a desirable effect) as the strings have very little output. The 'sweet spot' for strumming the soprano and concert ukes is around the point where the neck meets the body. The 'sweet spot' for tenors is a little closer to the bridge.


STRUMMING TECHNIQUE

Moving your arm rapidly up and down gets tiring very quickly. When you strum, use your wrist rather than your whole arm. When strumming down, you should be hitting the strings with your nail; when strumming up, with the fleshy tip of your finger.

UKULELE CHORD PROGRESSIONS

Here are some popular chord progressions to try out. You can put various chords together and create a song by yourself. Practice is very important: little and often is best. If you can practise for just 15 minutes every day, that will make you a better uke player than practising for two hours just once a week. Your fingers need to adjust and get used to stretching when changing chords. Even if it is your first ever musical instrument, you will become a uke master in no time!

Sound: Good for classical or jazz pieces, where individual

strings are plucked



Concert FLIGHT NUC310

Size: 23"

Tuning: GCEA Number of frets: 15-20 Sound: Full and mellow



Baritone FLIGHT NUB310

Size:30" Tuning: DGBE

Sound: Deeper sound, great for blues and fingerpickers
